Appendix I

About my work experience and my results

Over more than three decades, I have held senior roles at the intersection of **economics**, **innovation**, **science**, **and international cooperation**, spanning government, Nordic institutions, and one of the world's largest philanthropic foundations.

I began my career in the **Ministry of Economic and Business Affairs** in 1992, where I advised on European monetary integration and exchange rate policy.

In the **Prime Minister's Office** (1995–1997), I worked at the highest political level, preparing Denmark's Economic and Monetary strategy and contributing to Denmark's position in the Amsterdam Treaty negotiations.

From 1997 to 2001, as **Director in the Ministry of Economic Affairs**, I led Denmark's policy on EMU, the Euro, and international economic relations, representing the country in the EU Economic Policy Committee, OECD, and ASEM.

From 2002 to 2005, I served as **Head of Department for Welfare, Economy and Business** at the **Nordic Council of Ministers**, where I coordinated Nordic cooperation across finance, welfare, health, labour market, and consumer affairs. I represented the Nordic countries internationally, and supported analyses of policy reforms with cross-border implications.

In 2005, I transitioned to the Ministry of Science, Innovation and Higher Education, where over nearly a decade I shaped Denmark's innovation policies. I headed the Innovation Policy Department, the Research & Innovation Analysis Department, and the Secretariat of the Danish Council for Technology and Innovation. I designed national R&D and innovation programmes, developed impact evaluation methodologies, and represented Denmark in OECD and EU fora. Internationally, I advised Germany, Singapore, and Ireland on innovation and cluster policies, positioning Denmark as a global leader in evidence-based innovation policy.

In 2014, I became part of the **Novo Nordisk Foundation**, where I built and led its **Operations Areas** from 2014 to 2018, and the Impact Area from 2019 to 2025. I developed frameworks and analytics systems to measure the Foundation's societal and business contributions, directed CSR strategies, and published the annual *Societal Impact Reports* (2015–2024). I positioned the Foundation as a global leader in **impact management and science intelligence**, while also contributing internationally as a keynote speaker, advisor, and evaluator.

Across my career, I have combined **deep economic and research expertise**, **policy leadership**, **and international negotiation skills** with a strong focus on **impact**, **economics**, **management**, **innovation**, **and evidence-based decision-making**. I have advised prime ministers and ministers, represented Denmark and the Nordic countries in international negotiations, chaired influential committees, boards and programmes, and built new capabilities in one of the world's most significant philanthropic organizations.

Ministry of Economic Affairs (1992–1995)

Head of Section – European economic integration, EMU, exchange rate policy

In my first senior role at the Ministry of Economic Affairs, one of the most influential ministries at the time, led by Marianne Jelved, who was both Minister of Economic Affairs and Vice Prime Minister, I focused on Denmark's place within the rapidly evolving framework of European economic and monetary integration. The Maastricht Treaty had just entered into force, creating the roadmap for the Economic and Monetary Union (EMU) and ultimately the Euro. Denmark, with its opt-outs secured in the Edinburgh Agreement, had to carefully balance participation with independence.

- I prepared detailed economic analyses on the implications of EMU membership as well as
 on the impact of Denmark remaining outside the Euro Area (not participating fully in the
 third phase of the EMU), on convergence criteria, and on the stability of the Danish krone
 within the Exchange Rate Mechanism (ERM) in the European Monetary System (EMS).
 These analyses and policy recommendations contributed to the basis for Denmark's
 strategic decisions on exchange rate and monetary policy.
- I worked closely with the Danish National Bank and other ministries, ensuring that Denmark's fiscal and monetary policies were coherent and credible in relation to EU obligations.
- I represented Denmark in technical EU working groups, where I defended Danish
 priorities in discussions often dominated by larger member states. These negotiations
 required both a mastery of economics, international finance and the diplomatic ability to
 build alliances.

Key achievement: I contributed to contributing to Denmark's long-term strategy of maintaining currency stability while remaining outside the Eurozone – a policy that has since become a cornerstone of Danish economic credibility.

Together with my role as external associate professor at the University of Copenhagen, this role laid the foundation for my expertise in **macroeconomics**, **international trade**, **exchange rate policy**, **and European economic and monetary integration**, and positioned me as a skilled negotiator and analyst able to navigate the complexities of EU policymaking and to support the Danish Minister for Economic Affairs when participating in the meetings for economy and finance ministers (ECOFIN Meetings) of the European Union.

Prime Minister's Office (1995–1997)

Head of Section – EU economic-political cooperation, Amsterdam Treaty

Moving into the Prime Minister's Office placed me closer to the intersection of international politics and economics. Here, I advised the Prime Minister on EU economic, monetary and political issues at a time when the EU was preparing for major treaty reform through the Amsterdam Treaty.

• I was responsible for drafting briefing material, negotiation mandates, and strategy papers for the Prime Minister ahead of **European Council meetings**.

- I provided clear, actionable advice that translated complex economic and financial issues
 into political strategies, ensuring Denmark's positions were both technically sound and
 politically effective.
- I contributed to the **coordination of inter-ministerial input**, ensuring that all parts of government spoke with one voice during EU negotiations.
- I worked on balancing Denmark's institutional and economic interests within the Amsterdam Treaty negotiations, where the interplay of political reform and economic governance was central.

This period strengthened my skills at the **highest political level**: operating in a high-pressure national and international environment where economic analysis had to be paired with negotiation skills, diplomacy, and political sensitivity.

Ministry of Economic Affairs (1997–2001)

Head of Department/Director – EMU, Euro, International Economy, EU cooperation, OECD, ASEM

In 1997, I took on the role of Head of Department/Director at the Ministry of Economic Affairs – one of the most influential ministries at the time, led by Marianne Jelved, who was both Minister of Economic Affairs and Vice Prime Minister. Under her leadership, the ministry played a central role in shaping government strategy, making my position both highly visible and significant.

- Leadership and strategy: I headed the department responsible for Denmark's EMU and Euro policy, as well as broader international economic relations. My work spanned EU, OECD, and ASEM cooperation, giving me a broad international portfolio.
- International representation: Represented Denmark in a wide range of influential fora:
 - EU Economic Policy Committee (EPC), where I influenced the coordination of EUwide fiscal and macroeconomic policies.
 - Working Group on the Implementation of the Euro, where I helped prepare for the launch of the Euro. Even though Denmark opted out, my role ensured Danish economic sectors were ready to operate seamlessly in a Euro-dominated Europe.
 - Committee for Information Managers in the EU, where I worked on improving economic reporting systems to support evidence-based policymaking.
 - Nordic Finance Committee (EK-Finans) under the Nordic Council of Ministers, advancing regional cooperation on fiscal and monetary policy.
- Support for the Minister: I regularly prepared and accompanied the Minister of Economic
 Affairs in international negotiations and meetings, ensuring she was equipped with robust
 economic analyses and negotiation strategies. I acted as Denmark's representative in
 committees and working parties, often negotiating directly with European and
 international counterparts.
- Policy analysis and impact: Produced economic analyses of the consequences of major policy choices, including EMU membership, fiscal rule changes, and exchange rate policies. These analyses were critical in informing Denmark's national strategy and ensuring that decisions were based on rigorous economic evidence.

• **Global perspective**: Coordinated Denmark's participation in OECD and ASEM, where I engaged on topics ranging from global macroeconomic governance to trade and financial stability. Here, I had to bridge domestic economic priorities with global economic realities.

Achievements:

Played an **instrumental role** in supporting Denmark during its transition period surrounding the Euro, safeguarding national interests while remaining outside the Euro Area.

- Through reports, documents, articles and conferences, strengthened Denmark's
 reputation as a country with sound fiscal discipline, a credible exchange rate policy, and a
 constructive but independent voice in EU and OECD debates.
- Contributed to enhance Denmark's ability to operate internationally by aligning domestic policies with European and global frameworks, while also safeguarding national interests.

These roles highlighted my ability to work at the **intersection of economics, politics, and international diplomacy**, combining technical expertise with leadership and negotiation skills. I helped in ensuring Denmark's credibility and influence during a period of immense change in European and global economic governance.

Nordic Council of Ministers (2002–2005)

Head of Department for Welfare, Economy and Business

From 2002 to 2005, I served at the Nordic Council of Ministers, **the official intergovernmental body** for cooperation between Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland, and Iceland. This was a period when the Nordic countries were redefining their joint economic, social, and welfare agendas in response to European integration, globalization, and the challenges of demographic and technological change.

As department head, I had a broad mandate: I was responsible for preparing and coordinating ministerial work across several councils of ministers, including those for economy and finance, welfare and social affairs, consumer affairs, labour market, housing and construction, law, nutrition, and health. I acted as substitute for the Secretary-General in similar councils when required, and regularly supported Nordic ministers in their international engagements, providing both negotiation strategies and in-depth economic and policy analyses.

My portfolio spanned the **intersection of economics, welfare, and social development** — reflecting the Nordic model's integrated approach. I oversaw work on competitiveness, labour market reform, social inclusion, health policy, consumer rights, and housing, ensuring that policies were both forward-looking and consistent with the values of the Nordic cooperation.

A major part of my work involved **international representation**. I was engaged in the **Northern Dimension Partnership for Health and Social Welfare**, a multilateral initiative involving the Nordic countries, the Baltic States, Russia, and the European Union, aimed at strengthening health systems, combating social exclusion, and addressing cross-border challenges. I serviced and participated in numerous **working groups and committees (EK-groups)** of the Nordic Council of Ministers, including those on finance and economy (EK-Finans), social affairs and health (EK-

Social/Health), consumer affairs (EK-Consumer), labour market (EK-Labour), law (EK-Law), housing and construction (EK-Build), nutrition (EK-Nutrition), and drugs policy (EK-Drugs).

Another core part of my responsibility was to fund **analysis of policy reforms**. I helped to fund studies on the consequences of welfare, labour market, and business policy changes, providing ministers and senior officials with evidence-based insights into their economic and social impacts.

Key achievements during this period included:

- Strengthening the **integration of economic and welfare perspectives** in Nordic cooperation, ensuring policies were coherent and mutually reinforcing.
- Enhancing Nordic contributions to the Northern Dimension Partnership for Health and Social Welfare, positioning the Nordic region as a driver of cross-border cooperation on welfare and health.
- Supporting Nordic collaboration with solid **analyses and strategic advice**, ensuring Nordic collaboration were both politically viable and economically sound.
- Leading **cross-sectoral coordination** across numerous Nordic committees, balancing national differences while fostering joint initiatives.

This role demanded not only strong expertise in economics and welfare policy but also **negotiation skills, international diplomacy, and the ability to operate across sectors and cultures**. It was a pivotal period in my career, where I bridged national policymaking with regional and international cooperation, and where I tried to reinforce the reputation of the Nordic Council of Ministers as a model of collaborative governance.

Danish Ministry of Science, Innovation and Higher Education (2005–2014)

Head of Department/Director – Innovation Policy, Research and Innovation Analysis and Secretariat of the Danish Council for Technology and Innovation

From 2005 to 2014, I held senior leadership positions in the Danish Ministry of Science, Innovation and Higher Education, with responsibility for shaping Denmark's innovation policy. This decade marked a period of rising international competition, rapid technological change, and increased demand for evidence-based policymaking. My work was central to strengthening Denmark's innovation system, business R&D capacity, and international scientific cooperation.

I served as **Head of Innovation Policy Department** and later also as **Head of Department for Research & Innovation Analysis**, while during the whole period heading the **Secretariat of the Danish Council for Technology and Innovation (RTI)**. In these roles, I oversaw the design, implementation, and evaluation of major innovation programmes, coordinated cross-ministerial policy development, and provided ministers and government leaders with strategic advice on research and innovation policy.

Key areas of responsibility included:

• **Innovation policy leadership**: Designed and managed national innovation programmes supporting business R&D, public-private partnerships, and cluster development.

- **Evidence-based policy**: Directed analyses and evaluations of R&D and innovation investments, producing reports on business R&D, productivity effects, and innovation impacts. These studies became benchmarks for policy development in Denmark and internationally.
- International cooperation: Represented Denmark in the OECD Committee on Industry, Innovation and Entrepreneurship, in TAFTIE (the European network of innovation agencies), and in bilateral and multilateral innovation initiatives. I also advised the German government, Singapore's National Research Foundation, and Science Foundation Ireland on cluster policy and impact assessment.
- Cluster policy leadership: Chaired major initiatives such as the Nordic-German-Polish
 Cluster Benchmarking and the Baltic Sea "Perfect Cluster" programme, advancing
 regional cluster development and setting international standards for cluster excellence.
- Strategic innovation initiatives: Helped develop the Industrial PhD programme, R&D collaboration programmes for industry and universities, international cluster benchmarking methodologies, and advanced impact assessment tools, contributing to Denmark's global reputation in innovation policy.

Key achievements included:

- Establishing Denmark as a **pioneer in impact assessment and evaluation** of innovation and research programmes.
- Driving forward **R&D network and cluster policy development** across the Nordic region and Europe, promoting competitiveness through collaboration.
- Strengthening the **link between business R&D and public policy**, ensuring resources were targeted to maximize growth and productivity.
- Expanding Denmark's role as a trusted partner in **international research and innovation cooperation**.

This period highlighted my ability to combine **policy design**, **execution of R&D and innovation programmes**, **research funding**, **philanthropy**, **analytical insight**, **and international negotiation skills**, while also leading teams that shaped the future direction of Danish and European innovation policy.

Summary

From 2005 to 2014, I led Denmark's **innovation policy** as Head of Innovation Policy Department, Head of Research & Innovation Analysis, and Head of Secretariat for the Danish Council for Technology and Innovation. I **developed national innovation programmes, advanced impact assessment methodologies**, and represented Denmark internationally (OECD, TAFTIE, EU). I spearheaded cluster policies, evaluated the economic effects of R&D and innovation, and positioned Denmark as a leader in evidence-based innovation policy.

Novo Nordisk Foundation (2014–2025)

Head of Operations and Impact, and Senior Vice President for Impact

In 2014, I joined the **Novo Nordisk Foundation**, one of the world's largest philanthropic foundations. Over the decade, I built the Foundation's capacity in **grant administration**,

operations, **impact assessment**, **analytics**, **data management**, **and science intelligence**, ensuring that the Foundation's grants and programmes delivered measurable societal value.

From 2014 to 2018, I served as **Head of Operations**, where I was responsible for building organizational structures, grant administration systems, finance and CRS reporting, budget, impact reporting systems, and analytics capabilities to support the Foundation's rapid growth.

In 2019, I was appointed **Senior Vice President for Impact**, leading the Foundation's work on impact assessment, data and analytics, CSR, and reporting. My key responsibilities included:
